Addition to 10 000 and the corresponding subtraction (Grade3)

<p>2116 kg of garbage was plastic. 299 kg of garbage was metal. How much garbage is there altogether?</p> 	<p>There was 487 tons of garbage on the barge. Cap'm Duffy unloaded 396 tons of the garbage in New Orleans.</p>  <p>How much garbage was left on the barge?</p>
<p>There were 2228 km of coastline. The tug boat travelled 893 km of the coast. How much coast line was left to travel?</p> 	 <p>Cap'm Duffy was told to move his garbage on 5143 times in one month. He was told to move on 938 times in the next month. How many times was Cap'm Duffy told to move on altogether?</p>
 <p>There were 1988 tires on the garbage barge. Cap'M Duffy used 625 of them as bumpers for his tug. How many tires were left on the barge?</p>	 <p>There were 9482 rotting sandwiches on the garbage barge. Seagulls ate 288 of them. How many sandwiches were left on the barge?</p>
<p>Cap'm Duffy had to travel 5 639 m backwards before he could turn the barge around. He then went 6 212 m forward. How far did he travel altogether?</p> 	 <p>3294 jokes were told about the garbage barge. 2110 of the jokes were told on the radio and the rest on television. How many jokes were told on television?</p>
